 - Team reviewed the budget and asked clarifying questions
 - Talked about required hours for different roles versus what we have
 - One less para next year (1 per class K-2; .5 3-5)
 - Sped paras come from the district budget
 - Technology and property – some of it is mill levy funds
 - Extra classes – 1st to 2nd; 3rd to 4th
 - Right now 4th grade classes are around 33
 - If we get more than 35 then the next student gets sent to an overflow site, district has to provide transportation
 - Old ECE classroom – not big enough for a homeroom
 - Last time we talked about adding another admin support but that would mean 3 less paras therefore we will keep the para support
 - Per pupil funding

- 26/27 SY – \$6821
- Went back to PTSA for extra funds to help support this current staffing
- A SPED position is being Rib'd – licensure had open spots on caseload
- Next year there will still be a 5th special for the two grade levels that have 5 classes
- Budget unanimously approved by the team and signed by the co-chairs

 - Email from 1/26 – Lieutenant James Costigan
 - Due to significant gaps in the data, it is NOT reliable enough to share the full report at this time.
 - In the meantime, we continue to monitor and conduct targeted enforcement at the location with our District 2 LIDAR Officer on Mondays and Fridays (as availability allows).
 - Additionally, the request remains active with our citywide enforcement teams (Traffic Operations and Photo Radar) for their assistance.
 - Resources are stretched across the city and as well as our district due to multiple traffic complaints, but we are doing our best to address your concerns at E. 17th Ave / N. Elm St, during school ingress and egress hours.
 - Next steps for the team
 - Our crossing guard has been sending emails
 - PTSA also has a safety group – looking at how we can be in partnership with CSC

- Added stop signs
- Grant money – signs for yards in the neighborhood to promote school safety
 - McAuliffe also doing safety/traffic – look to collaborate
